## School Uniform

The children look very smart in our school uniform and we do expect all our children to wear it. Our school uniform colours are black trousers, navy jumpers and gold polo shirts and navy skirts and navy cardigans. As part of their summer uniform girls can wear yellow or blue gingham dresses and boys can wear black school shorts.

- All items of clothing should be clearly marked with your child's name.
