School Council Newsletter

The school council have been very busy this half term deciding what we should spend some school fundraising money on. Last year's Year 6 generated money after their enterprise scheme and some of our current Year 6 pupils have kindly donated money after they raised money after fund raising outside of school. After discussions with pupils in every class from Y1 - Y6, it was decided that the money should be spent on new playground equipment. After setting a budget, the school counsellors quickly got to the task of identifying exactly what equipment the children would like and how much we could afford.

We are pleased to inform you that we have been able to purchase most of the items requested by our pupils and that the new equipment will out on the playgrounds after half term. Our new equipment includes hula hoops, footballs, bats and balls, chalk boards, frisbees, Velcro bats and balls, tennis balls, skipping ropes, stilts, giant Jenga and musical instruments. Mid Term Tests

We did our mid-term assessments with our Y2 infant children and all the junior children this week to see how they are getting on with their English and maths. The teachers were very pleased with the positive attitude that the children showed in these tests. They will now analyse the results from these tests and use them to help shape the curriculum that they deliver after the half-term break. They will also be able to give feedback on the results to you in the autumn term parent evening meetings.

<u>Sleep</u>

This week, we have sent out an information sheet from the National Sleep Helpline. At any given time up to 40% of adults and 50% of children (this rises to 80% with a SEND diagnosis) have difficulties with their sleep. Yet in a recent survey, almost 60% of adults felt there was a lack of support for sleep issues. Sleep problems can leave people feeling isolated and lonely.

They have a free helpline which is run by trained sleep advisors, many of whom are specialists in working with SEND. They can talk to young people directly, or parents (they can also talk to adults, including older people, about their sleep issues).

The helpline is open 5 times a week, Monday, Tuesday, Thursday evenings 7-9pm, and Monday, Wednesday mornings 9-11am. The number is 03303 530 541.
