Weekly Updates... Spring Term Parents' Evening Appointments The spring term parent evening appointments give you a great opportunity to talk to your child's teacher and look at the children's work. Our spring term parents' evenings will be held in school and are set to run over two Monday evenings - 18th March and 25th March. Each parent evening slot will be ten minutes long. All the parent evening times will be booked through our online system – simply log on and choose which of the available slots you would like. The booking system goes live on School Spider today (16th February) at 6pm.

World Book Day – Thursday 7th March

We will be celebrating World Book Day in school on Thursday 7th March. The theme of World Book Day this year is, 'Read Your Way' and here at Wardley we want to keep the focus of our World Book Day celebrations firmly on this idea. 'Read Your Way' calls on everyone to let go of pressure and expectations, giving children a choice – and a chance – to enjoy reading.

Reading for pleasure improves children's life chances across a range of social, educational and well-being measures. However, research from the National Literacy Trust found that fewer than 1 in 2 (47.8%) children now say they enjoy reading; this is the lowest level since 2005, and reading enjoyment is lowest among children from disadvantaged backgrounds.

Happily, here at Wardley our School Council recently found that a much larger proportion of our children see reading as something they enjoy. Over 75% of the children in our infant and junior classes said that they really enjoy reading. This is fantastic – but we want to see all of our children feeling this way!

We will be inviting all the children to make up an A4 poster that shows what 'reading your way' means to them. The children can ask their class teacher for some A4 paper to take home for their poster. The poster can show what books they enjoy reading, where they like to read and what they like about reading. They can illustrate and write on their poster in any way they choose. All the children who bring a poster in will have the opportunity to share it with the rest of the school in a special world book day assembly. We will also be choosing one poster from each class to put in a frame and display in our school reading area. These winners will all receive a book of their choice.

We want the day to be a real celebration of reading. The children will all be invited to bring in a copy of one of their favourite books from home. The staff will also be sharing their favourite children's books with their classes. We will have lots of fun reading activities going on in school throughout the day.

Finally, if your child also wants to, they can come to school in their comfiest reading clothes or pyjamas to represent reading as a relaxing and pleasurable activity. It will be lovely to see how they enjoy reading and we will celebrate this in school. The day is all about getting the children to see themselves as readers, and we're so excited to see their posters, favourite books and comfy reading clothes!

Connect Wellbeing Day – Monday 26th February

We are thrilled to introduce our 'Wellbeing Day' initiative, which will take place on the first day back after every school holiday. We understand that returning to school after a break can be a little overwhelming for many children, so we have dedicated this day to focusing on their wellbeing and easing any stress or uncertainty.

Each 'Wellbeing Day' will feature non-academic activities centred around different themes linked to The Five Ways of Wellbeing, designed to help pupils' transition back into school life in a safe and supportive manner. Our theme for Monday 26 February will be 'connect', emphasising the importance of human connection in boosting wellbeing.

Some ideas you could try at home include: Taking some time each day to talk to each person in your family. Asking them how they are feeling. What was the best part of their day? What did they find tricky? How can you help them? Or why not try the Smile Challenge? Every time we smile, it releases happy chemicals in our brains. How many times can you smile in one day? The British Science Week 2024 poster competition is now open!

Over the last few years, we have had some fabulous entries from all year groups and we would love for more of the same this year. The theme for 2024 is 'Time'. The half-term break gives the children a perfect 'Time' to get planning!

Time is key to so many discoveries in science, technology, engineering and maths. Children could create a poster showing how a certain type of technology has changed over time, or even the advancement of time-telling technology itself. Budding poster makers could also go futuristic and show us how they think the world might look in years to come, or perhaps look at nature – lifecycles, lifespans, evolution and hibernation – nature is full of timely topics.
