It has been a lovely start to the summer term with the children enjoying our day of 'giving' on Monday which was part of our NHS '5 Ways of Wellbeing' programme. We have lots of events planned for the term ahead and we will be working hard to ensure that it is as productive and enjoyable for the children as we can make it. One of our key focuses will be on preparing the children for the transition into their next class. We recognise how big this step can be for them, and will be making sure that they are as wellprepared as possible. This week, we also received the OFSTED report from our February inspection; a separate letter has been sent out to you about the findings of the inspector together with the report itself. We were delighted to see the acknowledgement the report gives to the school's many strengths. We were also pleased that the single area for further development within the report was one that we had already identified ourselves and have been working on since the start of the current academic year.

In the classroom this week ... This week, Year 6 were visited by Prevent Protection, a group who focus on the prevention of children getting involved with gangs. The session involved a physical workout, including boxing skills which the children thoroughly enjoyed. They also completed a workshop where they listened to real stories of children, just like themselves, who ended up involved in gangs. The hope is that this form of education will make them more aware of the issues so that if they were to encounter it in the future, they could recognise it and walk away from it. This is the third year that we have had this team in school for what is always a very useful and insightful workshop. It was lovely to hear the positive comments from the group about the behaviour and attitudes of our Year 6 pupils who were, as always, a credit to the school.
