What does a Christingle symbolise?

Christingle - Christian festival of light Orange – The World Red ribbon - love and blood of Christ Sweets/fruit - God's creations Lit candle - Jesus's light in the world





How and Why does Sweden celebrate light?

Lucia Day (Saint Lucy's Day) is a Christian light and feast day. It commemorates the martyr Lucia of Syracuse, who brought food to Christians hiding in Roman catacombs, lighting her way with a candlelit wreath on her head.

- White dress, red sash, candle headdress
- Saffron bread (lussekatter)
- Ginger biscuits (pepperkakkor)

Why do Jewish people celebrate Hanukkah?

Hanukkah is the Jewish festival of light. It celebrates the Maccabees victory reclaiming their temple after it was desecrated by Greeks.

Hanukkah lasts for **eight nights** to how long the holy oil burned.

A **menorah** (candle holder) is lit each night

'Hanukkah' means 'dedication'





Diwali is a Hindu light festival that celebrates Rama's eventual defeat of the evil spirit Ravana, and his triumphant return to his home.

What is Diwali?

Hindus celebrate Diwali by lighting **Diyas** (oil lamps), home decoration, fireworks, **puja** (prayers), gifts, feasting, and sweets and families gathering together.
