It really has been a very cold week! However, we managed to keep most things going and the children certainly enjoyed the chance to play outside in the fresh snow with their classmates! We would like to say thank you to Mr Connor who worked hard to ensure that the pathways around school were cleared and salted. Unfortunately, the Y4 trip to Quarry Bank Mill was cancelled due to a broken boiler at the mill and the freezing weather conditions. Thankfully, we have been able to rearrange the trip for Wednesday 24th January. Hopefully, they will have fixed the boiler and the weather will have warmed up a bit! On the plus side, the cold weather has given the children plenty of opportunities to enjoy a good book inside in the warm! We have been very pleased to see the way our junior children are engaging with their reading on My Book Blog and Reading Plus. Each week, we put an update about how the children are getting on with Reading Plus on the Shout out Sheet.

In the classroom this week In Y5 the children have been working hard in science, describing the differences in the life cycles of a mammal and an amphibian. They have watched videos, researched and discussed the incredible metamorphosis that occurs in some animals. In the coming weeks, the children are going to be dissecting plants and looking at how they reproduce. Their History work has taken them back 1500 years to the Viking times. The Y5 children are currently looking at reasons why the Vikings migrated to Britain. They will be offering their thoughts on whether the available historical evidence always offer a balanced view about the Vikings - were they just vicious warriors?

Last year was the second time we ran our school ambition day, and the response to it was so positive that we wanted to do it again this year. So, we are going to have our third school ambition day on Friday 17th February. The aim is to get the children thinking about what their career ambitions for the future might be. Our school motto is 'We can do all things', and we want the children to have exciting aspirations about the types of job they wish to have when they are older. On the day, we will be getting the children to think about possible future career paths and the qualifications and experience that they will need to follow them.

As part of our ambition day, there are also some optional elements that the children can take part in - if they so wish. They can come to school dressed in the types of clothes that they would have to wear in the job that they want to have. We are also inviting the children to do some research about their dream job, and to bring in a poster about it on the day. If they choose to make a poster, it should explain what skills, experience and qualifications they will need for the job that they want. It should also explain why they would like to do that particular job. We look forward to seeing what our children aspire to be when they grow up!
