The school's governing board, with the support of the Local Authority and Diocese, have been working hard on the recruitment process for finding the school's next headteacher. It is an important appointment and their focus is on ensuring they have the right person in position to lead the school on the next stage of its journey forward. The post has been advertised but there has not been sufficient response to enable them to proceed with the recruitment process at this point. Plans were already in place for Mrs Walker to take on the role of acting headteacher over the summer term. The decision has now been made to extend this into the autumn term. The governing board will then re-advertise the post in the autumn with the aim of securing a new headteacher to start in January 2026. Whilst Mrs Walker is in the role of acting headteacher she will be released from her class teaching duties. In her place, we have appointed Miss Woodward as a class teacher and, together with Mr D Foster, she will be teaching our Y6 class over the coming summer term.

In the classrooms this week In Nursery, we have been reading Errol's Garden. After reading this, we have planted some cress to watch it grow. Next week, we will be enjoying our cress on cress and soft-cheese sandwiches! In Reception, we have been reading 'Winnie the Pooh Helps the Bees'. We have been learning about what bees needs to be happy, how to help the bees and why bees are important. Today, we are tasting honey! Ask your child if they liked it. After the holidays - we have a special surprise planned for the children in the EYFS. Little Barn Farm will be visiting school bringing along their new baby lambs and calves for the children to meet. We have had Little Barn Farm in school many times over the years and it is always a magical experience and brings new life to Wardley. The EYFS team would like to say Happy Mother's Day to all our Mums - we hope you like your special cards!

Easter Celebrations in School

We recognise that Easter is a very special time in the Christian calendar. Our collective worship this half-term, in the build up to Easter week, has been focused on the theme of Lent. We have been using resources from the Archbishop of York for this collective worship to help the children to 'Look Out and Look In' and think about the communities that they are part of. This reminds us of the time of reflection over forty days and nights that Jesus spent fasting in the desert leading up to Easter week. Now, as we arrive in the final school week before Easter, we will be hosting a whole range of Easter activities in school for the children.

Firstly, we are inviting all the children to make an Easter card at home, and bring it into school on Monday 31st March. These cards will then be collected by Father Jeremy to distribute to members of the local community. The Easter cards should have the message along the lines of 'Wishing You A Happy Easter from Wardley CE Primary School' inside. This is something that we have now done over the past few years and we have had some lovely thank-you messages sent to school from the people who have received them.

Then on Tuesday 1st April, all the junior classes (Y3 – Y6) will all be attending an Easter Service led by Father Jeremy and our Y6 senior pupils at All Saints Church at 10am. Parents and carers are welcome to attend. The service will see our Y6 senior pupils sharing Easter readings and prayers and all the junior children will be joining in and singing Easter songs.

Next, we will have the B Tales Christian drama group visiting the school on Wednesday 2nd April. They will be putting on a special show for our children all about the Easter story and its Christian message of hope. They will do this for our junior children (Y3 to Y6) in the morning and then another special show for our youngest infant and foundation stage children in the reception, Y1 and Y2 classes in the afternoon.

Finally, on Friday 4th April there will be an Easter service in school for our youngest infant and EYFS children. This will be led by our Y6 senior pupils and will give the chance for all our children from the Nursery, Reception, Y1 and Y2 to join in with Easter songs, prayers and celebrations in the school hall.

On Friday 4th April, there will also be an Easter Egg 'Spin the wheel.' A lucky attendance winner in each class will receive an Easter egg to take home.

Father Jeremy also extends his invitation to join the congregation at All Saints Church for the Easter services that will be taking place. He looks forward to welcoming parents, carers and children from our school to join him at the following services:

Easter Sunday: 20th April: Our Festival Service of the Sung Eucharist for Easter Sunday.
