Soon, the biggest Billy Goat Gruff came to the bridge.


"Who's that trip trapping over my bridge?" growled the troll.

Soon, the biggest Billy Goat Gruff came over the bridge.


"Who's that trip trapping over my bridge?" growled the troll.

"It's me. Big Billy Goat Gruff," said the goat.


"Then I'm going to eat you up!" roared the troll.
