Our Ethos Committee met this half term to evaluate our collective worship. We each spoke to our class about what we enjoyed about our collective worship. We also discussed what we think we could do to develop these special sessions during our school day. You can see some of the classes ideas below:

## Q1. How do you feel that collective worship has helped you?

**Y1:** It has helped us learn some songs and prayers. It has helped us to be kind to our friends and good friends ourselves.

**Y2:** It has helped us to trust our friends and one another. It has helped us to understand what Christians believe about God. It has helped us to be a good friend to others. It has helped us see how friendship is shown in the Bible.

**Y3:** It has helped us to be a good friend and live out the Wardley Way. We have learnt about new Bible stories and the actions of Jesus. We have learnt about what Christians believe the Holy Trinity is.

**Y4**: It has helped me be more respectful and appreciate my friends. It has helped show us how to manage conflict on the yard. It has helped show us how to trust people when it is not easy.

Y5: We have learnt how kindness can pay off. It has shown us the importance of friendship. That friendship can be more valuable than objects. How we can trust our friends. To understand the examples that Christians believe Jesus set for us.

**Y6:** It has helped me develop the Wardley Way in my life. It has developed my courage. It has helped me to be forgiven and have a change of heart. It has helped me understand Bible stories better

## Q2. What things do you like best about collective worship in our school?

**Y1:** Songs, prayers, dressing the worship table.
