Pole	The North Pole is in the Arctic and the South Pole is in the Antarctic. They are very cold places.	Continent	A large land mass: Europe, Africa, Antarctica, Asia, Oceania, North America and South America.
Coastline	The place where the land meets the sea.	Rainforest	Rainforests are hot, wet places full of many trees and plants.
City	A place where lots of people live and work. It is larger than a town.	Equator	An imaginary line around the middle of the Earth. It is a very hot place.
Desert	A dry area of land which receives very little or no rainfall.	Remote	A location far away from cities or towns - away from people.
Human geography	Human geography focuses on where people live, what they do, and how they use the land.	Physical geography	Physical geography is the study of the Earth's natural features, such as mountains, rivers, deserts and oceans


